
<u> Carlton County Gravel Pit Access – Agate Picking Map</u>

Permit holder agrees to respect the property rights of Carlton County, NO climbing on stockpiles, NO tampering with machinery, NO entering pits in operation, NO leaving trash/garbage at the pit, permit holder waves any right to litigate against the County of Carlton for any injury sustained while on Carlton County property.

The Moose Lake Area Chamber of Commerce is the starting point for directions to all gravel pits.



Carlton County Airport Pit (~2 miles from the Chamber office) – County Highway 61 South, right to pit entrance. Look for white sign on tree, it is a small gravel road. Note a small white cross near the entrance on 61. Park in front of barricade, then walk around to enter. DO NOT venture too far to the left as you will be entering Airport property and they may come and tell you to leave.



Hatchery Pit (~4 miles from the Chamber office) State Highway 73 north (Arrowhead Lane) to County Highway 61 North to E Agate Road turning just after Sunset Memorial Cemetery. Drive ½ mile to pit entrance and park above, DO NOT drive down into pit.



Soo Line Pit – (~2.7 miles from the Chamber office) north on State Highway 73 (Arrowhead Lane) changes to Highway 27 north, left to Halgren Road \sim 3/4 mile walk to pit entrance. This is the longest walk from parking to the pit. It is about a 10-15 minute walk.
